I stated that many processors are not subject to the Groceries Code Adjudicator and that there is a huge gap between those on aligned and non-aligned contracts. The disparity in milk production costs and the price that dairy producers receive is extremely worrying and I will continue to campaign for fairness and transparency in our dairy industry.

On Monday I visited the International Paper Foodservice facility in Winsford. I found my visit to the site extremely interesting and I learnt that every KFC 'chicken bucket' in the UK is made in Eddisbury. International Paper is a major employer in Eddisbury and residents of the constituency can be proud that they provide products used by millions of Europeans.
