

This is the true story of **Christmas**. Christmas is the day we celebrate the birth of Jesus.


God sent his Son, Jesus, to be born on earth because he loves us very much.





Christmas Day Food



If you kept up with the November edition you already have your pudding in the bottom of the fridge. Unfortunately you should have made the Christmas cake in October (yes I was also too busy) so you can rush it in the first weekend in December (Mary Berry link below) or just cheat and buy a rich fruit cake, make holes in it with a skewer and pour a weekly glass of sherry or brandy into it. Keep it well wrapped with greaseproof paper.

A week before Christmas spread apricot jam over and roll out marzipan to the size of the top of the cake. The next day roll out purchased icing to cover the marzipan (or make royal icing e.g. Mary Berry's https://www.bbc.co.uk/food/recipes/classic_christmas_cake_04076 (step 11)) and put cake decorations and frill on to finish.

In our household Christmas cake is very popular served in the traditional Yorkshire way (thanks to John) with a slice of Wensleydale cheese. How that came about I have no idea and it seems weird, but actually it's a great combination of flavours.

Keeping stress out of the main event is mostly achieved by preparation the day before:

- cooking a good supply of pigs in blankets for the children to munch (as they
 get hungry at a different timetable to the meal),
- peeling boring potatoes etc (keep in a bowl of water in the fridge for a day),
- making any side dishes like cranberry sauce which I used to buy until I discovered how easy it is to make (boil 340g cranberries in 250ml water plus 100g of soft brown sugar for about 10 mins until softened. Cool and add a large teaspoon of vanilla essence and salt and pepper)
- any starter (mackerel or salmon pâté is a nice contrast to the meat course, try https://philshomekitchen.org/2016/04/05/the-easiest-quickest-smoked-mackerel-pate-in-the-world/) and
- brandy butter for the pudding (beat 200g of softened salted butter with 175g of icing sugar and 1 teaspoon vanilla essence. Keep beating as you add around 5+ tablespoons of brandy. Keep in a bowl in the fridge and serve directly onto warmed (microwaved) slices of the pudding you made last month.....

Christmas Day - Add a turkey (actually always beef in the Smith household, so I have no idea how you cook it—good luck) and its all done.







26th December—Boxing Day Traditions

The name comes from a time when the rich used to box up gifts to give to the poor. Boxing Day was traditionally a day off for servants, and the day when they received a special Christmas box from their masters. The servants would also go home on Boxing Day to give Christmas boxes to their families. I'm sure no-one waits until Boxing Day to open their Christmas gifts these days....

The very BEST of Boxing Day has to be the big *fry-up* of yesterday's spare roasties, sprouts, with leftover sausages and turkey and the spare gravy, absolutely delicious. How many people hear it said that "it's better than the Christmas dinner"?!

By the time you have had tea time turkey sandwiches with the last of the stuffing and cranberry sauce you should have got most of the turkey eaten up.

Epiphany— 6th January
