#### Note From The Editor

#### **Rectors Letter**

Autumn is my favourite time of year. As the warm days of late summer give way to autumn, the trees are a riot of colour and there is a crisp chill in the air. The seasons are changing. The nights come earlier, and the days are shorter. The colour on the trees gives way to bare branches that stand proud against cold winter skies. Winter beckons

The abundance of life that fills the summer days is coming to end, at least for this season. But in these darker days, life continues at a gentler pace. The fruit fallen from the tree buries itself in the ground and waits. The seeds scattered from the dead flower heads lie just under the surface of the ground and they wait too.

All are waiting to spring into life when the time is right: when the winter chill in the air has gone, when the earth gently warms, and when the days begin to lengthen. They sit and wait knowing that spring will come as it does every year, and when it does, those dormant, sleeping seeds will spring into life. That is the circle of life. Each season depends on the season before it. Without the dying down of plants, there can be no new growth.

Our lives can seem like seasons. There are times when life seems new and exciting. At other times life is full of joy and growth. There are also times when we seem to be moving out of one season to another; times when we feel we are in a season of transition. At other times, we seem to be waiting and at times we can find ourselves in a season that is not where we want to be.

In Ecclesiastes we read "For everything there is a season, A time for every activity under heaven" (Ecc 3:1). Wherever you are right now, know that it will not last forever. The

seasons of our lives change just like the seasons of the earth. One season cannot start until another one ends, and each season depends on the one that has gone before. Even in those darker colder seasons, we are preparing for growth and renewal - just like seeds lying dormant in the ground.

#### The Pilgrim Porch at Chester Cathedral

Chester Cathedral is the mother church of the Diocese – a Christian community encompassing 273 parishes – and the seat of the Bishop of Chester. Despite being one of the most important medieval buildings in the north west of England, the Cathedral has a problem with visibility. Visitors – both tourists and worshippers – to our building are often unsure about where to find us, what we do, and whether they can come in.

The Pilgrim Porch will address these issues of visibility. As part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee commemoration, this project will see a set of interior transparent doors being installed at the west end of Chester Cathedral in 2022. Once complete, the Pilgrim Porch will allow our arresting medieval wooden doors to remain open to the city, and allow a view of the interior of the Cathedral church from the outside: reinforcing the idea that we are an open, welcoming Church, guided by the mission 'Discovery, Encounter, Faith'.

The relationship between Cathedral and Diocese is at the heart of this project. Artist Stephen Broadbent – renowned for his sculpture and artwork across the country, and in Chester for The Celebration and The Water of Life, located in Chester Town Square and Chester Cathedral Cloister Garden, respectively – has designed the sculptural bronze porch with ceremonial glass which will feature, etched in the design of a labyrinth, images significant to churches across the diocese. As visitors gaze on our impressive church interior, they will get a sense of the communities across Cheshire invested in heritage and faith and will begin their own journey of pilgrimage in Chester Cathedral.

"St. John's Threapwood is designated by English Heritage as a Grade II\* listed building. The authors of the Buildings of England series state that it is entirely Georgian in style. Situated on the south side of the Paradise Brook, St John's Church was built in 1815 on waste land belonging to Threapwood and consecrated on January 8th 1817 by the Bishop of Chester. The church yard was later consecrated on 1st Jan 1829 by Dr Sumner - Bishop of Chester.

The domestic appearance of the exterior and the use of iron make this an unusual and significant ecclesiastical building. The integrity of the original design remains largely intact due to only limited additions (such as a discreet vestry inserted in the 1900's). The church is a single cell brick building, with no separation between the nave and chancel. However, a kind of cruciform is achieved internally by the placing of doors on the north and south elevations, creating a crossing with the central aisle.

The interior is distinguished by a gallery on three sides, supported by cast iron pillars and wrought iron railings, which can also be seen around the communion table. There are box pews, for the Kenyon and Broughton families, either side of the table at the east end, and two types of pew in the nave, the ones closest to the front being simpler in design.

In recent years the slate roof was renewed and the pretty bell tower containing its single bell."
