513 PLANNING

513.1 Applications:-

20/04491/FUL - Single storey rear extension at 35 Oathills Malpas

The application is to demolish the utility room to make way for a larger kitchen. This property is semi-detached. The planned extension will extend out into the back garden as far as the lounge making a straight line as opposed to L shape it currently is. The extension will abut the dividing wall between the two properties. Policy BE3 of the Neighbourhood Plan applies to this application.

The property is in the Conservation Area and the Council would wish to ensure that the Conservation Officer is happy with the design and materials to be used.

The Council would wish to ensure that its principles on climate emergency together with those of CW&C are applied to this.

The Council note that the red boundary line on the location plan does not align with that as shown on CW&C's public map. The red line boundary map appears to have included land which doesn't belong to this property. The Council would wish to see a revised location map showing the correct boundary lines.

20/04253/FUL - Loft conversion with front and rear facing dormers and single storey rear extension at 11 Springfield Road Malpas

This is a revision to an existing application. The only change is that the street scene is altered due to the front facing dormer window. Policy BE3 of the Neighbourhood Plan applies to alterations and extensions. In addition, the Council would wish to ensure that the neighbours are not overlooked in a detrimental way. CW&C together with Malpas Parish Council have declared a climate emergency and the Council would therefore expect this application to comply with this.

513.4 Bovis:-

The Council have written to the Planning Department, CW&C to convey the Council's concerns as the Council has been trying for several months to arrange a meeting with Bovis to discuss various site related matters. The Council is concerned that Bovis will leave the site with these matters unresolved. The Planning Department have replied to advise they will mention the request to Bovis though they cannot force Bovis to speak with the Council.

The following issues have been reported to the Enforcement Officer who has advised they will be investigated:-

- blocked storm drains to CW&C.
- Parts of the wildlife corridors appear to have been annexed into private garden.

513.5 To receive planning updates:-

There are no updates.

514 COMMITTEES

The Council discussed the purpose, structure and different requirements in the ways of the working of the Planning, Finance and Personnel Sub Committees.

The recently adopted TOR for the Planning Sub Committee is not working in its' current format therefore a revised TOR has been prepared and circulated to the Council for consideration. The Council discussed whether the Planning Sub Committee ought to have delegated powers and how to manage the Neighbourhood Plan.

Cllr Boxall had previously circulated notes regarding the purpose of each Sub Committee.

Each of the Sub Committees are to review the TORs (the Planning Sub Committee has done so).

515 CHRISTMAS

515.1 Report Regarding Lighting in the Village:-

The new Christmas street lights have been added to the Council's Fixed Assets Register. An email has been sent to Zurich to add the item to the insurance schedule. Zurich have confirmed that they have added the Christmas street lights to the insurance

policy and that there will be no additional cost between now and the renewal date 31/05/2021. Upon renewal of the insurance policy, the annual increase for the lights will be approximately £27.00.

515.2 Old Christmas Street Lights:-

Cllr Williams informed the meeting that the old Christmas street lights have been offered to Malpas Alport Primary School.

516 APPEARANCE OF MALPAS

516.1 Planters / Dog Bag Dispensers:-

The Clerk has chased CW&C for an update regarding the licences. CW&C have yet to respond.

516.2 Bench:-

The Clerk has contacted CW&C to advise that the PC wish to site the bench on Chester Road between the top of the Bovis estate and the cemetery and to request a site meeting to discuss the most suitable location.

516.3 Complaint:-

The Council has received a complaint regarding the state of the land off Malpas Footpath FP 8. This is to be reported to the relevant departments at CW&C.

517 ALLOTMENTS

Update:-

- Any new enquiries received are to be added to the waiting list.
- There are currently three people on the waiting list.

518 BUS SHELTERS / STOPS

The Ward Cllr R Williams and the Clerk have been chasing CW&C for an update regarding the replacement bus shelter on Old Hall Street.

CW&W have responded to confirm that if the shelter design and the location provided for the audit are followed they have no issue from a road safety perspective. If the bus shelter is moved away from the Old Hall entrance or away from the wall then forward visibility will be affected which would be unacceptable. CW&C have advised that should the Council wish to proceed then in the first instance the Council contact the property owners in the vicinity of the site to ensure their support for the scheme, then contact CW&C to discuss practicalities and provide estimates for groundwork preparation and kerbing upgrade.

Cllr M Williams is to pursue this with CW&C as the Council felt it was not their place to contact the neighbouring property owners.

519 SPEED GUN

Lockdown restrictions have meant that use of the speed gun has not taken place. As soon as the Council have the opportunity to do so, dates will be set.

520 CLERK'S REPORT

The Council noted that many of the unfinished tasks being handled by the Clerk relate to matters that require CW&C involvement (the licences for the dog bins has been on the agenda since February 2020). There was also Council criticism of the tone and length of the reply given by a CW&C official on the felling of trees on the former St Joseph's site.

There was recognition of the difficulties that CW&C is facing in the current pandemic but the Council agreed it should express its dissatisfaction with the general lack of support the Clerk is being given and this should be raised formally with the local CW&C Ward Councillor as a matter of urgency.
