MALPAS PARISH MAGAZINE: MARCH 1869

'On Thursday evening a meeting was held in the vestry room of the Parish Church of Malpas, to "take into consideration the amount of dilapidations charged on the houses in Old Hall-street, that are now out of lease through the death of Mr Gardner, and the cost of ascertaining the death of the said Mr Gardner from America" It appears that eleven cottages and three plots of land were leased to the township of Malpas, in the year 1789, for three lives, the last survivor being Mr Gardner, who emigrated to America, and died there about three years ago When the lease was granted there were no workhouses, and this property was leased to provide houses for the poor of the township.'




