233. PRECEPT

The 2024 – 2025 Local Council Tax Base for the parish of Malpas has been calculated as 1092.9 for Band D equivalent properties.

The Band D Local Council Tax Base for 2023 – 2024 was 1071.3 for Band D equivalent properties.

Resolved:- The Council agreed to set the precept for 2024 - 2025 financial year at £31,006.00. This represents an increase of £613.00 (2.02%) on the 2023 – 2024 precept amount.

There will be no change with the Local Council Tax Charge for a Council Tax Band D property for 2024 – 2025. This will remain the same as 2023 – 2024 at £28.37. This means there will be an increase of £0.00 (0.0%) in the Parish Council's 2023 - 2024 share of the CWaC Council Tax bill.

234.1 Update:-

234.2 Potential s106 funding:-

The Council had agreed to contact local organisations to enquire if they have any requirements for the potential s106 sum of £20,068 to be allocated towards enhancing park and recreation provision within Malpas.

The Clerk has contacted CWaC and for further advice / clarification regarding the allocation of the potential s106 funding.

CWaC has advised that the Council needs to be careful so as not to raise expectations and also to ensure that any suggested potential sums and site allocations are appropriate for the typology that has triggered the sum in the first instance.

CWaC has provided the following information regarding the allocation of a potential

CWaC has provided the following information regarding the allocation of a potential developer sum triggered for parks & recreation enhancement:-

"A potential developer sum triggered for parks & recreation enhancement should be allocated to a site which offers a range of recreational & open space functions i.e. traditional parks or recreation grounds. The park & recreation typology can include sports such as bowling & tennis. But football, rugby, hockey & cricket cannot be considered for allocating any potential park & recreations sum. These sports & potential sums are assessed separately using Sport England's sports pitch calculator, our Playing Pitch Strategy and would be allocated to priority sports pitch site within the Rural South PPS, not necessarily within the Malpas locality.

Looking at the council's open space mapping for Malpas the only sites that's mapped as parks & recreational sites is Malpas Recreation Ground, plus some potential for either enhancing tennis or bowling provision at the Malpas Sports & Social Club. As both would fit the criteria for the parks & recreation typology."

234.3 Existing s106 funding:-

The Council made the following suggestions for the sums that are allocated towards Highways traffic management:-

- Wrexham Road – extending the footpath to include the section that is missing.

- St Oswalds Close improvements to existing footpath which is in poor condition.
- Old Hall Street:- request that the proposed VAS on Old Hall Street is swapped for a pelican crossing.
 - Wrexham Road to explore traffic calming options with CWaC.

235. PLANNING

235.1 Planning Applications:-

236. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Mike Boxall has sent the following update on the work of the Malpas Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (MNPSG):-

"The Parish Council received a report, presented by Chris Whitehurst, in October 2023. This indicated that the original objectives of MNPSG had just about been completed. MNPSG had gathered additional material to support a review and possible rewrite of the Neighbourhood Plan and set in motion work to provide draft design codes and a summary of the need for and design of environmental protections. MNPSG also passed on advice from CWaC planning department that it might be prudent to delay further work until the national framework for planning controls became clearer, particularly with an election pending, and even modest changes to the NP requiring extensive consultation and approval.

Since that date the MNPSG has received the output from the two outstanding project - Protecting and Enhancing Malpas' Natural Environment and Malpas Design Guide and Codes. They should provide a valuable and helpful resource for any future work the Parish Council decides to undertake on the Neighbourhood Plan.

As the October paper indicated, any future phases of work will require a new Steering Group to be established."

Cllr Whitehurst advised that there are a number of questions to ask CWaC regarding the sustainability of rural housing numbers.

237. MONTHLY SURGERY

The January monthly surgery took place in the Old Fire Station Bistro. Update as below:-Query:- Wrexham Road:- when is the pavement going to be installed.

Response:- The pavement is not owned by the council, the planning application does not have specifics on completion date. Highways department are pushing for the developer to complete.

Query:- Hedge at the bottom of the car park.

Response:- The hedge will be taken down eventually but there are part two items for the car park that need finalising first.

Query:- Old Hall Street - new bus shelter.

Response:- A licence has been applied for to relocate the stop which will then follow a clear way being installed. Also informed that Highways England completes the licence which takes time and should be done by March.

Query:- Flooding to Mastiff Lane.

Response:- This has been reported to CWaC.

Query:- Safety mirror installation opposite Mastiff Lane.

Response:- The council do not manage or approve safety mirrors and that landowner's permissions were to be sought by residents themselves.

Query:- Hedge on Mastiff Lane.

Response:- Request send to land owner to cut the hedge.

Query:- Traffic outside the Heber.

Response:- This is a police matter and has been passed on to PCSO McKevitt

Query:- Old Hall Street / Cedars VAS.

Response:- CWaC Has advised that a wide based post is required for the VAS; the cost to install is over £10k which is over the allocated budget. CWaC are to look into alternative funding to support completion of the project.

Query:- Cross Update.

Response:- The Council have had three quotes have been done and work and will be pressing forwards to get work done.

Query:- Removal of tree with TPO at Malpas Sports Club during the Christmas break.

Response:- Agreed that no application has come in for work to be done; to check with the tree officer that the tree has not be moved due to storm damage or disease if not enforcement will be actioned.

Request for the Council to support a resident group who can monitor TPO trees in Malpas. There has been a breach of TPO regulations and CWAC are making enquires with enforcement to establish who has given permissions for the tree to be removed.

Query:- Church Street potholes.

Response:- A full report has been sent to the principal engineer. Resident to keep reporting and encourage others to do so. Requested for clarification from highways around suggestions of a resurface that is delayed due to Berwyn development not completing the payment at the front of the development. The potholes have now been filled.

Query:- Request for Census information 2021 to find out the population of Malpas.

Response:- Ward Cllr Williams is to follow this up and send direct to resident.

Query:- Request for pavement cleaning on Old Hall Street / Old Malpas Road / Doctors.

Response:- This has been reported to CWaC.

Query:- Request from No Mans Heath resident to have street name changed on CWAC system as it is wrong causing delivery issues.

Response:- This has been reported and is now corrected.

238. THE MOSSLAND

238.1 Allotments:-

Update:- Plot 2 has been let.

Separate accounts have been set up for The Mossland; the income and the key deposits have been transferred from the Malpas Parish Council's bank account to The Mossland's bank account.

Cllr Shackleton agreed to act as the Council liaison with the Allotments Association.

Cllr Whitehurst advised that the recently installed ponds have blocked the drains to the neighbouring field.

238.2 Charities Commission:-

The Charities Commission has since replied; the Clerk is to make further enquiries.

238.3 Trust Deed Document:-

The Clerk has confirmed engagement terms for Hill Dickinson to prepare the Trust Deed Document. The draft trust deed in due next week.

239. SLOW DOWN FOR MALPAS

Cllr Schoene circulated a report proposing to set up a working party to deliver a campaign throughout the village encompassing all four main roads into Malpas and the High Street. The working party would work with other organisations, including the police and BRAKE, to deliver the project.

Cllr Willliams is to liaise with Cllr Schoene to set up a working group including residents.

240. SPEED LIMIT

The Council agreed to instruct CWaC to carry out an assessment for 30 mph speed limit to be implemented after Chorlton Villas, Whitchurch Road, Malpas.

The speed gun is to be kept at the Jubilee Hall to enable access for Threapwood and No Mans Heath Parish Councils who contributed towards the cost.

241. CHESTER ROAD CROSSING / PAVEMENT

The most recent update from CWaC was "The S106 monies will not be able to be change for a Zebra Crossing without the permissions of Bovis and Bovis are refusing to allow the change." Ward Cllr Willams has suggested getting the residents of Bovis involved to see if they can persuade Bovis to change their minds or create a petition.

Cllr Waddelove requested that CWaC provides a detailed explanation including costings and as to why the pavement cannot be installed.

242. HIGH STREET CAR PARK

CWaC is due to respond later this month regarding the legal agreement for the proposed car park extension.

243. THE CROSS

Two out of three quotes have been received to clean and repoint the steps surrounding the Cross.

These have been submitted with the Application for Scheduled Monument consent form to Historic England.

244. CCTV – PHASE TWO

Barlows has now installed phase 2 CCTV in the High Street.

Cllr Lightning updated the meeting regarding the recent request made by the police for CCTV footage due to an incident that took place in the car park.

Cllr Lightning advised that the village fair will take place on 13th July 2024.

The Village Fair Committee is to be set up as a subcommittee of the Parish Council; the Council is to formally consider the TORs at the February meeting.

Consequently, other than any required lining renewals (which we will fund) there are no further plans for improvement at this time. It is worth noting that the speed limit reduction would include the bridge and any concerns the PC have may be assisted by a speed limit reduction."
