




Malpas Yesteryear Rally, a brief history

Hampton Hall (1972 – 1976)

The Malpas Vintage Machinery Association was born from an idea by local residents Rob Randles and Bill Evans early in 1971. The first gathering of likeminded local enthusiasts took place later that year at Hampton Hall.

In the spring of 1972, an advert was placed in the Whitchurch Herald and the Chester Chronicle inviting vintage enthusiasts to take their vintage tractors, barn engines and machinery along to an event.

The first public rally took place at Hampton on the east side of the A41 trunk road on Sunday 17th September 1972. It was attended by 8 vintage tractors and 5 barn engines.

The rallies were held at Hampton up until 1976.

1976 was a drought year with no rain in the Malpas area between the end of March and 16th September, two days before the rally was scheduled to take place.

During the site setup on the weekend before the event, it was almost impossible to get the main ring fencing stakes into ground, which was baked hard.

On the Saturday morning after 3 full days and nights of heavy rain the stakes were falling over.

Needless to say the event was a wash out with very few paying public attending the event. This left the Association in severe financial difficulties and on the verge closing down forever.

Cholmondeley Castle (1977 – 1978)

Given the problems and issues with the Hampton site, a new venue was sought, and treasurer David Johnson with his farming connections managed to secure the Cholmondeley Castle parkland for the 1977 event.

A new committee of just David Johnson, Hubert Willet, Les Evanson and myself was formed. I was elected as Secretary and Yesteryear Event Director, with Hubert and Les being joint chairmen.

At the 1977 event, the introduction of market stalls and exhibitors dressed in period costume coupled with the attractive venue helped to boost public attendance.

Two very successful years were held with an annual public attendance of approximately 20,000 was instrumental in putting put the association back on a sound financial footing.

Gredington Park at Hanmer (1979 – 1988)

However, problems in 1979 with poor communications through the estate office staff resulted in the loss of that venue. So, the 1979 rally moved to Gredington Park, Hanmer, where it resided for the next 9 years

This was brave move on the committee's behalf because on a pre-event visit it was almost impossible to walk across the park due to the wet nature of the ground. This must have been the association's sustainability destiny, as the first year and each subsequent year, the site provided dry and firm ground conditions.

The rally continued to thrive and grow at Gredington, apart from one hiccup with the Lords Day Preservation Society when an individual threatened to take the organisers and the landowner to court for charging a personal entry fee on a Sunday.


The irony was that the landowner was already a Justice of the Peace and was revelling in the prospect of having to stand in the dock in front of one of his fellow magistrates.

However, after taking legal advice, the committee voted to carry on with the event and employ a legal option, which was to charge for car parking, and ask pedestrians for a donation.

This did give the police some aggravation as people were parking on the roadside and looking to walk into the site for free.

The rally returned to its roots at Hampton in 1989 where it has continued to thrive since allowing us to celebrate our 50th Year.




