## **Passport to Care - A New Initiative**

In collaboration with a local charity Snow Angels, OPAL has been awarded a grant for £150,000 under the Government Levelling Up scheme to promote work in the care sector. This will provide valuable skills and experience for those wishing to pursue a career in the wider health and social care areas.

The 'Passport to Care' programme will be delivered by OPAL, partnered with Snow Angels, two organisations with a wealth of experience supporting older people in Cheshire West and Chester. Both charities can offer a range of volunteering opportunities for people taking part.

The 'Passport to Care' programme offers volunteering experiences with older people and carers. This may take place in community settings, in older people's homes, and via the

telephone. There will also be a series of training opportunities for example, first aid, dementia awareness, safeguarding, and an understanding of grief and bereavement available to those involved. This structured volunteering programme will provide volunteers with skills and knowledge which could lead to a career in care.

It is hoped the programme will support vulnerable communities in Cheshire West and Chester by having a positive

impact on the wellbeing of older people and their access to health and social care services. The programme will provide practical help and support to reducing social isolation and loneliness. It will also support the sustainability of local VCS organisations who will deliver training where relevant.

The scheme is open to a variety of volunteers and, for the first time, we are inviting volunteers who are aged 16-18 to join our volunteering team. We kick started our publicity programme by attending three Career Fairs each attended by over 1000 students from all over west Cheshire.



## **Funding Success**

In August, OPAL received the grant agreed earlier in the year by Cheshire Community Foundation for £15,000 to part fund a new project that OPAL are running. This project will provide an improved and more responsive form of carer support to unpaid carers of older people with dementia and the people they support.



During late Summer, OPAL learnt that it had been chosen as one of two local "good causes". OPAL will, as a result, benefit by 2p in every £1 from purchases made by Co-op members. Co-op members across the country can register and choose OPAL as their "good cause". October 2023 saw the start of what will be 12 months accumulation of donations. We thank the Co-op and its customers for this opportunity.

In September, we were delighted to receive, from the Skipton Charitable Foundation, £3000 to contribute to both our Carer Support services and GoOnLine services.



In October, we learnt that we had been fortunate enough to have benefitted from The Lord Mayor of Chester Fund in respect of the previous year when the Lord Mayor was Councillor John Leather. We are indebted to him for his interest in OPAL and this kind donation of just over £3,500.

We were overwhelmed by our guests generosity and raised over £1,000 over the course of the evening.

October saw the return of our knitted chocolate oranges. OPAL volunteers and members knitted some lovely ornamental and chocolate orange pumpkins to suit the autumn season. The knitting continued into November ready for our Christmas chocolate oranges, so far our seasonal pumpkins have raised over £500.

In November, OPAL's Christmas celebrating began in full swing with our Christmas Fair and Afternoon Tea. We were joined by stallholders from across the region to display their wares and enjoy a lovely afternoon of crafts, tea and of course a lot of cake! Thanks to your support we raised an amazing £1,250.
